The National League of POW/MIA Families, incorporated on May 28, 1970, was formed to obtain the release of all prisoners, the fullest possible accounting for the missing and repatriation of all recoverable remains of those who died serving our nation during the Vietnam War. Without the League, America's POW/MIAs would have been forgotten long ago. The League is proud that our efforts led to today's worldwide mission. We are also proud that our flag is universally and legally recognized as the symbol of America's commitment to account for our POW/MIAs.

The League is a humanitarian organization, financed by contributions from the families, veterans, and other Americans. Donations are gratefully accepted, tax-deductible to the extent allowed by law, and may be made by sending a check to the League office, electronically by visiting www.powmia-families.org, and through the Combined Federal Campaign (CFC #10218) or United Way.

The League's voting membership is comprised of the wives, children, parents, siblings and other close relatives of Americans who were or are listed as POW, MIA, KIA/BNR, and returned US POWs from the Vietnam War. Associate Membership is comprised of extended family member relatives of POW/MIAs who do not meet the voting requirements, veterans, and other concerned citizens.


