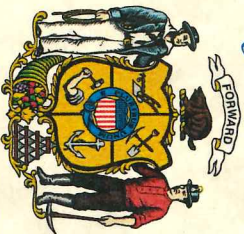

Proclamations

WHEREAS, POW – MIA Recognition Day honors the sacrifices of American service members who suffered, or still suffer, in captivity while on active duty as Prisoners of War, or who were or remain Missing In Action; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 2001 Wisconsin Act 100, the State of Wisconsin has declared that every third Friday of September should be designated as POW – MIA Recognition Day; and

WHEREAS, according to the National League of Families of American Prisoners and Missing in Southeast Asia, 1,598 Americans are still missing from the Vietnam War – including 26 from Wisconsin – 126 from the Cold War, and 72,934 from World War II, though thousands from World War II have been assessed as unrecoverable deep-sea losses; and

WHEREAS, we continue to honor all POWs, and the U.S. Government should persist in fully accounting for every service member classified as MIA; and

WHEREAS, U.S. service members continue to serve at significant personal risk, and we have profound gratitude for the courage, determination, and resolve of POWs and MIAs, and remain mindful of their families, friends, and fellow veterans who continue to wait for a resolution; and

WHEREAS, in Wisconsin, the black and white POW – MIA flag is flown over the Capitol as a symbol of that unwavering commitment;

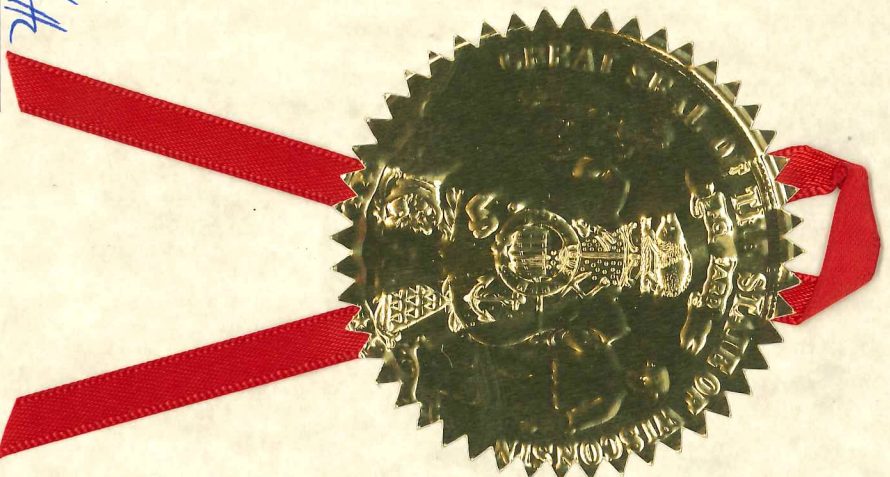
NOW, *THE* **GEORGE**, I, Scott Walker, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
